<b>B</b> OSTON MASSACRE	
<p>On March 5, 1770, a group of young colonial dock workers and British soldiers faced off outside a customs house. A British soldier had stones, ice, and coal chunks thrown at him. More British soldiers arrived. The colonial mob taunted the soldiers. A fight broke out, and the soldiers began firing. Crispus Attucks, a former slave, and four other colonists were killed. The shooting was referred to as a "massacre," and Patriots used the incident as anti-British propaganda in newspaper articles, posters, and pamphlets. The colonists were outraged by the incident. Paul Revere's famous "Bloody Massacre" engraving appeared in many colonial publications.</p>	1215 1607 1620 ★ 1776 1787 1803 1861 1865 1877

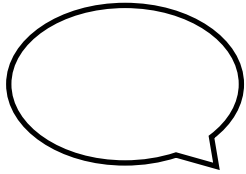

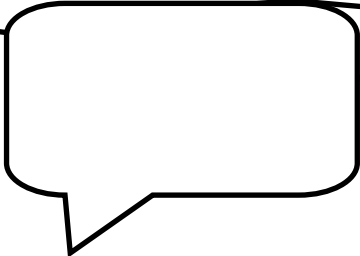

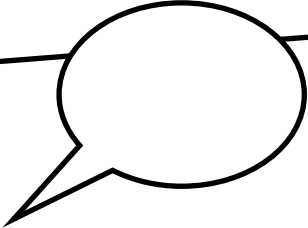
