



## SKILL: Cause and Effect

 <b>STAMP ACT CONGRESS</b>	
<p>The Stamp Act Congress met in New York City in October, 1765, to voice colonists' concerns about British taxes being imposed on the colonies. Nine of the colonies sent delegates to the Congress which drew up a petition to the King protesting the Stamp Act. They argued that taxation could only be carried out by colonial assemblies, and not by the British Parliament in which the colonists had no representation ("No taxation without representation!"). 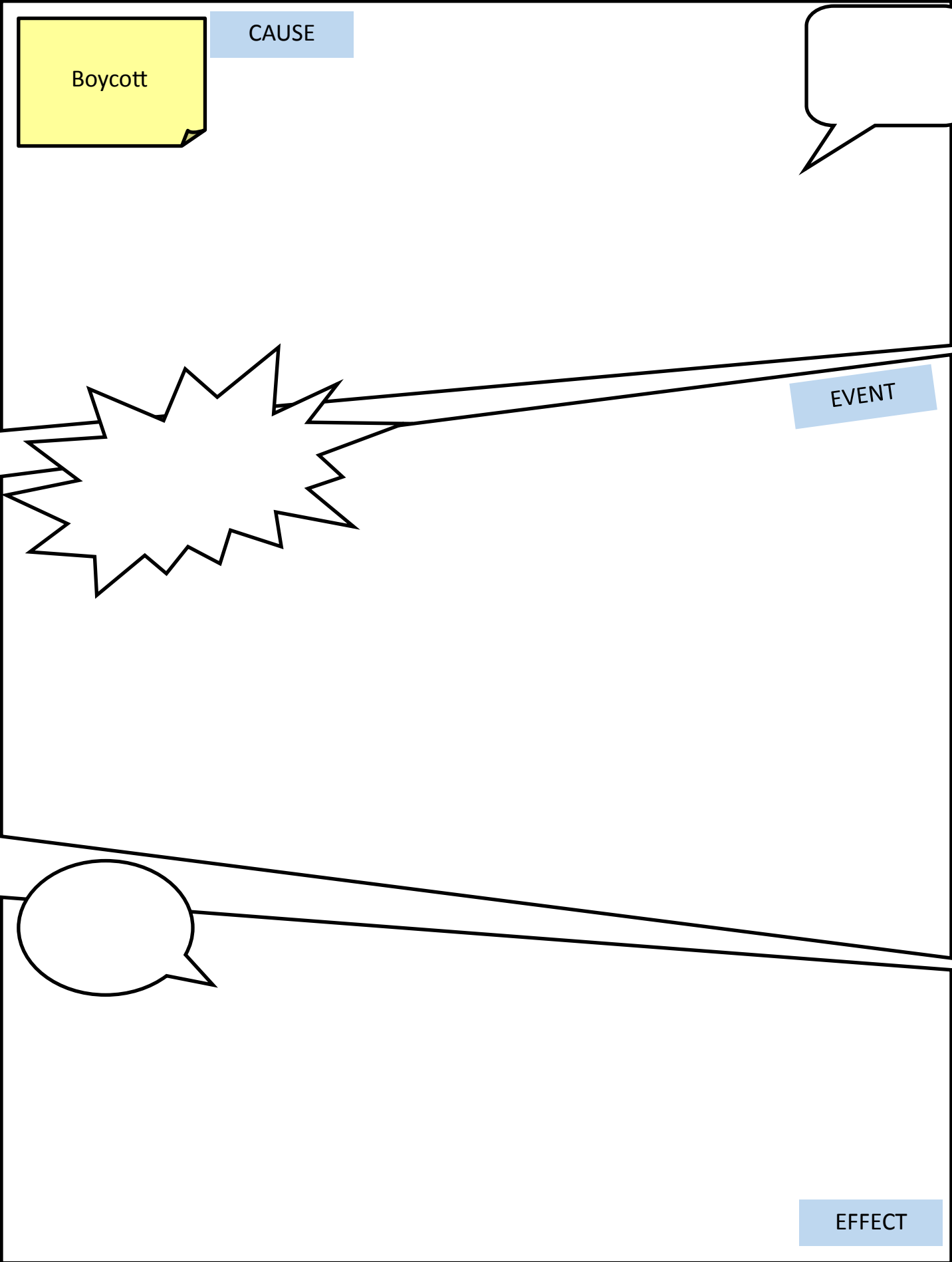
